
















































<mark>impuls</mark> festival

Already for the 9th time, the impuls Festival offers a rich and versatile daily music and discourse program. Contemporary music, presented in diverse formats and settings also beyond traditional stages (e.g. MinuteConcerts, staged and installative concerts, Late Nights) is hereby brought to various locations in the City of Graz – from small informal locations and galleries (such as kunst.wirt.schaft, Museum der Wahrnehmung, Haus der Architektur a.o.), to esc medien kunst labor and Forum Stadtpark, up to concert halls, such as MUMUTH and Helmut List Halle. Different venues at Kunstuniversität Graz (KUG) of course play a central role also for the impuls Academy activities.

In February 2025 impuls once more welcomes internationally renowned top formations (amongst others Klangforum Wien, Quatuor Diotima, Trio Accanto, Trio Sun-Weiss-Fussenegger), coaching, rehearsing, producing and performing on spot. Besides, further young and rising ensembles (amongst others NAMES, Schallfeld Ensemble, Chaos String Quartet, Kandinsky Quartet) as well as individual musicians, electronic performers, vocalists and of course also composers offer an intense inside view in the richness and diversity of contemporary music by presenting works composed in the 20th and 21st century. Amongst them one can find an impressive number of world and Austrian premieres - many of them produced specifically for and during impuls. During the first three days of the festival, a special focus is put on the Austrian music scene with a variety of concerts also during the day, while on the following, equally dense festival days, productions by international artists take over.

On top, lectures, discussions, composers' talks and other **music communication programs** enhance the impuls Festival program and the Academy alike. This way new music, be it classical modern or most current one, can be experienced first hand both in theory and practice, discourse and sound.

impuls academy

Founded by **Beat Furrer** and **Ernst Kovacic** back in 1997, impuls, the international Ensemble and Composers Academy for Contemporary Music and Association for the Communication of Contemporary Music has developed into one of the internationally leading institutions in this field. Instrumental, vocal, chamber music and ensemble coaching, composition classes, reading sessions amongst others with Klangforum Wien, various calls for scores, electronic workshops, special programs such as "Team Composition", "Intermedia Collaboration", "Digital Dialoques", "Speculative Sound Synthesis", "Emphasis on multimedia and music theatre", developed specifically for the Academy edition 2025, ...: Every second year the impuls Academy offers young musicians and vocalists, composers as well as other artists - from Austria, but also from all over the world – an intense training and holistic approach to contemporary music, both in a theoretical and practical way. For 12 days impuls hereby builds an important platform for joint working, mutual learning and international exchange in Graz, Styria. An international team of renowned performers and composers as coaches quarantees highest quality and builds the basis for excellently educated, highly motivated and internationally interlinked young artists as competent and authentic messengers of contemporary music.

In 2025 the impuls Academy is once more welcoming composers, electronic artists, vocalists, instrumentalists as well as already existing ensembles, chamber music formations and string quartets as its participants. Alltogether more than 230 young artists from close to 45 nations and 5 continents assemble in Graz and partly also present their work at the impuls Festival.

impuls competition

impuls promotes and supports young composers not only at its Academy, but also through competitions. Every second year impuls organises the international impuls

Composition Competition, commissions new works for ensemble from composers selected, and invites them to work with Klangforum Wien, one of the world's leading ensembles. Five new compositions derived out of this program also for 2025, the world premieres are scheduled for February 25th at the impuls Festival. Furthermore the interested audiences may also learn more about these composers and their works at composers' talks as well as through videos produced by AVL Cultural Foundation within the series "Composer Portraits".

Apart from its Competition, impuls commissions also other young composers, e.g. within the framework of projects such as "Text im Klang" and the Ulysses activities.

impuls events

In addition to the impuls Composition Competition, the Academy and Festival, impuls occasionally offers short Workshops for young musicians residing in Austria and provides a stage for them through formats such as the "impuls MinuteConcerts". impuls also initiates interdisciplinary projects such as "Text im Klang", commissions new works and develops a cooperation network with other art organizations to stage education programs and concerts such as "impuls@< rotor >".



From its very beginning back in 2012, impuls . Verein zur Vermittlung zeitgenössischer Musik was an active member of the European ULYSSES Network, supported by the European Union already for three editions. By now ULYSSES is seeing its fourth edition as ULYSSES Platform, running from October 2024 until March 2028.

At this stage the Platform brings together 13 European partner institutions from 12 European countries, all involved in the support and promotion of young artists. Verein zur Vermittlung zeitgenössischer Musik (Austria) + Internationale Ensemble Modern Academy (Germany) + JVLMA Contemporary Music Festival "deciBels" (Latvia) + Mixtur Festival (Spain) + Stichting Gaudeamus Muziekweek (Netherlands) + Stiftelsen Ultima Oslo Contemporary Music Festival (Norway) + Viitasaaren Kesäakatemia RY / Time of Music (Finland) + Vsl "Rupertas" (Lithuania) + Związek Kompozytorów Polskich (Poland)

These institutions (academies, ensembles, festivals etc.) play a fundamental role in the recognizing, accompanying, professionalizing, and developing of the careers of young European composers, performers, and artists in general. Of those partners, several have engaged in supporting them for longer than 20 years. The network has chosen the name ULYSSES, the emblematic European figure of a symbolic journey, personifying human and artistic adventures.

In 2025 impuls does not only welcome at its Academy and Festival several young composers, electronic artists and musicians on their journeys supported by the ULYSSES Platform, but also Chaos String Quartet and Kandinsky Quartet as two young emerging ensembles, as well as the IEMA-Ensemble 2024/25 of the Internationale Ensemble Modern Academy, one of our partner organisations. Another focus is put on collaborative "In-Situ" projects this year, with special programs such as "Team Composition" (led by Matthew Shlomowitz and Dimitrios Polisoidis) and "Intermedia Collaboration – percussion, electronics, video, gestures, performance" (led by Pierre Jodlowski and Christian Dierstein).

"You still have to have chaos in you to give birth to a dancing star" (Friedrich Nietzsche). The Chaos String Quartet's motto is to follow its very own and fundamentally sincere path, a path that seeks to overcome supposed boundaries. And so the combination of tradition and contemporary tendencies is inscribed in the string quartet's DNA. Interdisciplinary performance projects and children's concerts are developed, in the case of "Free The Franz" with the Hungarian jazz saxophonist István Grencsó again, Schubert is placed in a new context, and other unusual ways of programming are taken to open up unexpected rooms and bring audiences from different backgrounds on a joint path of listening. For their first appearance at impuls, the four musicians span more than a century of music history, including also a graphic score as well as a late composition by Josef Matthias Hauer, who, like the much better known composer Arnold Schönberg, developed his own version of twelve-tone composition already in the 10s of the 20th century.



Daniel Lercher, born in 1983 in the Austrian countryside, is residing and working as a musician, composer and soundartist in Vienna. His work focuses on electroacoustic composition/improvisation, live-electronics, phonography, installations, music for dance & film, etc. In his solo performance at impuls he works with the projection of a digital oscilloscope, via which so-called Lissajous figures and other visualizations of the sound layers are depicted. The geometric figures are generated from the sound by superimposing different forms of vibration on two axes (x,y). The sound comes from a laptop and ranges from simple sine tones to noise.

The Kandinsky Quartet, founded in 2020 and based in Vienna, has gained recognition within shortly. Recently the guartet won a first prize at the Gasteig Competition in Munich (2024). and it is also a winner of the Verbier Festival Anniversary Prize 2023, the Salzburg International Mozart Competition and the Boccherini Competition. Furthermore it was selected for the EU-funded MERITA project. At its debut concert at impuls, the Kandinsky Quartet presents the 10th, penultimate string guartet by Georg Friedrich Haas, which is to be played in complete darkness - a special challenge for the musicians. Haas: "Composing for darkness is fundamentally different from traditional composing: you do not directly score the piece - you compose a process for individuals, forced to perform in isolation, having only aural contact with their partners." It is preceded by "A Failed Entertainment" by Clara lannotta, teaching at the impuls Academy as does Quatuor Diotima, for which she wrote the work. In the composition she intensively explored the topic of form and time – her "first attempt at working beyond the sound itself," as she once put it.

Having been connected to impuls in various ways over the years, Graz based Schallfeld Ensemble presents its first concert of the 2025 season (dedicated to "Body" as main theme) within the impuls Festival. Starting with the experience of pain (and confrontation with hybridity, otherness and detachment) in Panariello's work, the program clashes into the hyperbolic description of Gargantua's gigantic body (Bertrand) and finally arrives at Khubeev's paradoxical musical investigation of the body as a linguistic medium. With Carola Bauckholt and Misato Mochizuki again, two renowned composers teaching at the impuls Academy, are included in the program, opening up the possibility to work and exchange closely with them.

Schallfeld, founded in 2013, sparks the interest of its audience by its vivid virtuosity and refined chamber music sound, paired with interpretations that pay special attention to concert format, creating events that adapt to the specific venue while aiming for a new dimension of listening. The ensemble strives to bring music of international young composers to Austria and in turn act as an ambassador for new music productions abroad. Besides its own concert cycle, Schallfeld is a regular guest at festivals in Austria and abroad. It was part of the NASOM program and long-term Ulysses-Network Ensemble in Residence. In 2022 Schallfeld Ensemble was awarded the Grand Interpretation Prize of Land Steiermark.

After a three-day focus on the Austrian music scene, international guests, teaching at the impuls Academy, will now have their say on two evenings – tonight twice as soloists, twice in trio constellations. Trio Accanto has been praised for its "mastery" and "world-class interpretations" since 1994. The instrumentation of saxophone, piano and percussion is common in jazz, but was a rarity in classical music (leading to the description "a jazz trio that doesn't play jazz") until Trio Accanto reversed this situation, inspiring more than a hundred composers to write new works over the years. Trio Sun-Weiss-Fussenegger will in turn give its debut concert at the impuls Festival 2025, hereby also premiering three



commissioned compositions. In addition to composers of the younger generation, the program also includes well-established composers such as Rebecca Saunders and Nadir Vassena, who have taught at the impuls Academy in recent years, as well as Misato Mochizuki, who is joining the Academy team for the first time, and furthermore former impuls composition competition winner Oscar Bianchi. With Christian Dierstein and Nicolas Hodges again, two of the most internationally renowned long-term interpreters of contemporary music will contribute solo pieces by two female composers, the young Iranian Elnaz Seyedi and Rebecca Saunders, who was recently awarded the Golden Lion for her life's work at the Biennale di Venezia.

With Quatuor Diotima, you can look forward to another evening of moving quality and inescapable fascination. Misato Mochizuki, for example, uses some functional peculiarities of the human brain as the starting point for her 2nd string quartet "Brains". Mochizuki: "The quartet consists of the four brains of the musicians, but it is also an independent unit, a unified nerve centre. The composition is thus driven by imitation, on the basis of patterns that are constantly changing in search of identity and in their relationship to the other and to others (musicians)." Like her, also Lisa Streich is teaching at the impuls Academy for the first time this year. Streich's quartet "Sternenstill", created in 2020 at the beginning of the pandemic on Gotland, will dissolve time and space for a few moments. Streich: "I live very close to the airport. Normally, there were always lots of planes flying over my house. That suddenly stopped completely. It was a completely different silence. It gave me a completely different peace to look at. perceive and observe nature. Then I noticed that butterflies move their wings very slowly when they sit on a flower. I had never seen that before. That's actually what the piece is about." Dieter Ammann's 2nd string quartet again is based on establishing distances and bridging them as a compositional leitmotif, and, last but not least, in Pascal Dusapin's 5th string quartet, Samuel Beckett ("Mercier et Camier") is given a wordless voice.

Every second year impuls opens a call for its international Composition Competition, commissions new works for ensemble from the composers selected and invites them to work intensively with Klangforum Wien, one of the world's leading ensembles, at the impuls Composition Workshop. Hereby impuls contributes to the careers of young and internationally rising composers, aside from supporting young composition

participants at the impuls Academies and including the younger generation of composers in other impuls projects such as "Text im Klang".

Tonight another five commissioned works by composers from Argentina, South Korea, Thailand, South Africa and the USA will be premiered at the impuls Festival. Aside from videos, produced by impuls sponsor AVL Cultural Foundation and presented in the foyer tonight, anyone interested to meet the composers also in person and find out more about their works, can do so before tonight's concert at a half hour Composers' Talk. A more in depth analysis of the works and discussion with the composers and Vimbayi Kaziboni is scheduled for February 26th, 9.30 at KUG, followed by a full day with Reading Sessions with Klangforum Wien and Kaziboni for composition Academy participants, where, amongst others, questions on formal and aesthetic aspects, notation and instrumentation are discussed.



Damian Gorandi Digital Suicide (2024, impuls commission, world premiere)

"Digital Suicide" is inspired by the Argentine writer Adolfo Bioy Casares' novel "The Invention of Morel", delving into themes of digital landscapes and distorted realities. The piece reflects on how new digital tools shape our habits and alter our perception, seeking not only to mirror our current world, but also to offer an escape from it. This work is also a personal exploration of my own complex cultural heritage. Of Ukrainian descent, raised in Latin America, and now living in France, I draw upon multiple cultural influences to shape my music. In this work, I aim to express this cultural hybridity. Rich in references to Argentina, my country of birth, "Digital Suicide" also incorporates echoes of pre-Hispanic Andean music. The work creates a dialogue between ideas from new technologies and elements from Latin America, bridging ancient worlds with today's industrial and digital universe. This clash of realities forms an erratic sonic dramaturgy, transporting the audience into an immersive environment. Ultimately, the piece reflects on the relationship between humans and new technologies, suggesting that answers may lie in marginalized cosmogonies and cultures. In my creative process, I like to imagine music that is not of the present, but rooted in a very distant past or in an unknown future. (D. Gorandi)



Jieun Jeong volatile (2024, impuls commission, world premiere)

The term "volatile" was my starting point in the composition process and describes a transitory, constantly changing state – a material that can hardly be brought into a fixed form. In this composition, it is a fleeting, constantly changing sound space: a musical fabric, whose elements form over time into a complementary interplay and constantly unfold anew, while becoming increasingly abstract in the process of depersonalization. The sonic material moves between extreme states, in which a sound is perceived as both a maximum and a minimum state. The boundaries of these states are blurred, transitions overlap and hover in an in-between space, where everything is ultimately defined by our ear: Here sounds begin and end within the same sound field – and our perception experiences them as maximum or minimum states. (J. Jeong)



Piyawat Louilarpprasert Parasite (2024, impuls commission, world premiere)

In my imagination, a "parasite" is an organism that comes into contact with musical instruments. This idea prompts me to consider the transformation of sounds from instruments that could be achieved by attaching some small objects, such as putting a small noise squeaker in wind instruments, equipping string instruments with small metal clips, installing rubber materials on the surface of drums, and so on. The sounds produced by the combination of the main instrument and objects offer an acoustic phenomenon that includes a variety of frequencies through harmonic instability and multiphonics in both high and low registers — created by object experimentation. (P. Louilarpprasert)



Njabulo Phungula ochre song (2024, impuls commission, world premiere)

"ochre song" is, simply, an exploration of layers. I was very interested in exploring how to treat layers of sound as layers of physical matter. How does one material react when in contact with a specific material? There are three main types of musical layers in ochre song; grain, fluid, and earth. These layers are presented in a variety of combinations and ratios. which reflect what I imagine would be the outcome, for example, of granular objects mixing with certain fluids, or indeed how the ratio of one layer to another would affect its character. Some of the sonic gestures that represent these ideas are based on my own instinctive musical response to the material in question. For example, temple blocks and string pizzicati representing granular material, whilst slow, bowed, alissandi in the double bass, or the sound of a friction mallet being drawn across the skin of a bass drum represent the depths and ever-shifting qualities of the earth matter beneath us. On a more personal note, othre song, in some ways. allows me to revisit my earliest experiments in music-making some 17 years ago, when I would mix-and-match a variety of pre-recorded musical materials in a Digital Audio Workstation, building layers of sound one track at a time. Form, then, becomes a very crucial parameter here for tying together this musical exploration. (N. Phungula)



Kelley Sheehan strainer (2024, impuls commission, world premiere)

"Strainer" is a work for impuls and Klangforum Wien, entirely acoustic. This piece explores the elastic boundaries of tension and collapse, focusing on the inevitable moments of awareness that occur just before a system either fails or transcends. As this system accumulates pressure, a sense of strain intensifies as it approaches this breaking point, yet it is denied total disintegration. In this, there is joy. (K. Sheehan)

Described as a conductor of "great intensity, without distancing, maneuvering, without indifference" (NZfM) Zimbabweanborn conductor Vimbayi Kaziboni is widely sought-after for his depth of approach, interpretive imagination and expressivity, as well as his innovative and thoughtful curation. Kaziboni has led many critically lauded performances with orchestras across the globe, performing at some of the most prestigious concert halls in the world. In January 2024 he was appointed conductor-in-residence of Klangforum Wien.



25 musicians from 13 countries are constantly exploring new horizons of artistic creativity together with the most eminent composers of our time. Open-minded, virtuosic in performance and aurally perceptive. Klangforum Wien one of the internationally most renowned ensembles for contemporary music - devotes itself to the artistic interpretation and expansion of experiential space. A performance of Klangforum Wien is an event in the best sense of the word; it offers a sensual experience, immediate and inescapable; the novelty in its music speaks, acts and bequiles. Ever since it was founded by Beat Furrer in 1985, the ensemble - which, over the years, has received a great number of awards and distinctions - has written music history: It has presented around 600 world premieres, it boasts an extensive discography of more than 90 releases, appearing at the most prestigious concert halls, opera venues and at major music festivals.
